# **News from SIS**

### Singapore International School @ Saigon South

It's a busy time at SIS@SS. The GAC students have completed Level 2 and after Level 3 will finish the program. The A level program is also preparing the students for the official Cambridge exams that will run through May and June. These students will be presented at the Senior Concert on 28 June, as well as at the formal Graduation dinner and presentation evening on July 8 2015.

The success of our students after they graduate from our school continues. We recently held a Skype meeting with Pham Minh Triet who graduated in 2009, with a GAC perfect GPA of 4. Triet spoke with our current GAC students, as well as students from the IGCSE1 and IGCSE2 classes. The students had the opportunity to ask many questions including how to improve their IELTS score, scholarship opportunities, how to manage time and the best strategies that helped him to be successful with his studies.

Triet made the point of stressing the importance of making the best use of the resources available to students at SIS@SS. For example, Ms Lien Huong is the 'best' resource to help students improve their language proficiency and IELTS score. Triet also commented on the excellent education offered by SIS@SS and is very appreciative to the school and his teachers. He recommended that students should complete programs such as GAC and A levels and then enter university as an international student.
