Message from Principal

Dear Parents & Caregivers,

Thank you to the Peoples Committee and the Police who visited our school for Teachers Day and acknowledge the special contributions Teachers make to not only our school but the community. Thank you also to the parents and students for the beautiful flowers and cards. We have a talented group of Teachers here at SIS Da Nang and I want to thank them for the commitment they give to our students and the school.

Our school is continuing to grow and develop, we are looking for opportunities to assist our students in experiencing success with pathways to further study and their careers. In the next academic school year (2021-2022), we would like to offer the Cambridge A & AS Levels. This is the most highly recognized International program for secondary students in the world. This will assist our students in accessing Universities both locally and around the world. In some cases, the successful completion of the A- Levels will provide credit for some University courses. We will need to confirm enrolments soon to ensure we are able to recruit appropriately qualified staff for this program.

I need to further remind parents that we are no longer allowed to bring outside foods into the school for Birthday parties etc. This is due to a case of food poisoning at another campus. The only items that we can allow, are cakes and sealed packaged snack foods like chips and biscuits etc. The other option is to order foods from Pegasus catering company, which is located on our campus. Please be noted that this is available for afternoon snack only at SVIS recess time 2.20 -2.40PM and SIS recess time 3.00 – 3.15PM. Please also consult with your class teacher.

I would like to apologise in advance that we will not be able to celebrate the Christmas Fair and Concert as a community, as we normally would. We still have COVID restrictions in place preventing us from allowing a large number of visitors on to the school grounds. So parents will not be allowed to attend. We will still proceed with a modified event here at school and will post the concert items on-line to share with parents and families. Thank you for your understanding.

Message from Head of Kindergarten

Dear Parents

We would like to take this opportunity to say "Many thanks" to our parents for the lovely flowers, gifts and best wishes on the Vietnamese Teachers' day.

This year, we have embedded Letterland in our Phonics program to reinforce the alphabet letters and sounds, which prepare our children's reading readiness skills.

Letterland was created to teach phonics using a story-based approach. While the Phonics stories give children a friendly logic for remembering all 44 letter sounds, simple stories about the Letterland characters ensure correct letter formation.

Children in all classes were doing their best to become academic achievers and confident communicators. While K2 and Prep were learning to read words, K1 and Nursery learned to practice self-help skills, such as washing hands, cleaning up the toys and feeding themselves during lunch.

Prep International has been putting their rubbish to good use by recycling items, they would normally put in the bin into new things. As part of their STEM lessons, they have been using their imaginations, creativity and practical skills to create a whole range of items from pencil holders to rockets!

We have made Razkids accounts for our Prep students to use during their ICT times. This is a great online reading program with a variety of topic-based leveled books. We will send detailed login information home as soon as the children know how to use it well at school.
