## Message from SVIS Principal Dear Parents

After completing the eighth week of the new academic year, I am pleased to report the students have settled happily into their class routines. Students have demonstrated their own talents and performance abilities and were very interested in finding ways to develop in the most positive way.

Currently, students are learning to use additional software about experiential activities and STEM topics to help them expand their global vision and real life. Primary students have taken the quality test of Vietnamese (on September 18) and Math (on September 25) and Secondary school students have a once-only test in all subjects. This helps teachers to accurately assess the learning ability of each student to make supplementary teaching plans for the weaker students in term 1. Student report card in the middle of Semester 1 will be sent to parents in October 2019.
