Message from Principal Dear Parents,

It is fantastic to have students back on campus, happy and learning. I would like to comment on the outstanding behaviour of our students. Many teachers are reporting the good behaviour and how hard students are working in class. Our staff are working hard to ensure we continue this enthusiasm with quality teaching. We recently, had our AS-Level students attend classes on the weekend to help prepare them for upcoming exams.

The uniform is an important part of Singapore International Schools. We need to ensure our students are wearing the school uniform correctly. This includes both formal and sports uniform. Dear Parent,

In March, it has been great to see all students were able to return to school, the number of students attending school is increasing day by day. Currently, it has nearly 80% of students go to school, the percentage is highly increasing about 40% than the beginning of the month. - Year 9 students are preparing to review for the Semester 2 exam scheduled from April 25 to 29.

Message from Head of Kindergarten Dear Parents

It was exciting for our Kindergarten's first few weeks back. It was wonderful to see the children happy and healthy. All the children get on well with their classmates and teachers while adapting to the new environment and learn to follow the rules. The students' engagement and participation in lessons and activities has been shown daily.

We have learned about being kind and gentle and diversity around the world and how we can use it inside and outside the classroom.

Plants and how they effective our lives were the theme of the month. Prep students had fun-filled nature walks around campus and see our very own vegetable garden and had the opportunity to plant their own seeds in the classroom to nurture and watch grow and eventually plant in the garden.
