Dear Parents & Caregivers,

Welcome back to Term 2. This will be a very busy term with a number of major events and importantly exams and reporting to be completed. We are looking forward to returning to on-campus learning and there are some positive signs this could occur soon.

Some of our older students have commenced getting the COVID vaccine. This has occurred with our students born in 2006 or older (yr 10 and above). Thank you to the parents and our school staff for helping to facilitate this.

Also, our teachers and school staff are now in the process of getting the second dose of the vaccine and we hope this will be carried out in the very near future. We are doing what we can to ensure we are ready to reopen the school safely, when we are allowed, to do so.

We are in the final stages of completing a school wide literacy program to assist with the teaching of reading and writing. This ties in with our school wide action plan. Reading and writing are fundamental skills that are imperative to a students educational development.

There are 5 key skills to the teaching of reading. These are phonemic awareness (how to produce sounds and pronounce words), phonic and decoding (letter sound relationships), vocabulary (sight words), fluency (the ability to read fluently and with expression and obeying punctuation rules), and comprehension (the ability to understand what you are reading).

Reading and writing are closely linked together. Both depend on a fluent understanding and use of language at many levels. Each enhances the other. We will be working on developing and strengthening 8 writing traits, these include purpose, ideas, organisation, voice, word choice, sentence fluency, conventions (punctuation) and presentation. Effective writing incorporates these traits.

It is unfortunate when staff leave mid-year, however, this happens in all schools not just international schools and sadly we would like to farewell Ms Hannah and Ms Cecilia and wish them well with their careers. We have a new teacher starting this term, Ms Jade Reidy. Ms Jade, is a South African teacher, who has been working in Vietnam and is now joining us at SIS Danang. Ms Jade will take on the Prep International class, when we return from on-line learning. In the meantime she will support with some relief teaching and supporting students while we are online. In addition, there will be some other new staff joining us soon. We will introduce when they arrive.
