Message from Deputy Principal (Secondary)

It is the time of year when teachers begin sending home progress reports and comments to inform parents of success their children are having in the classroom. These unit tests, projects/presentations, quizzes and other assignments can be considered and referred to by teachers as Classroom Based Assessments. This can sometimes leave parents to as the questions - What are CBAs? Why are CBAs important? How do CBAs impact my child's scores?

Classroom Based Assessment is an important part of the teaching and grading cycle here at SIS DaNang. CBAs are formative assessments that are used to check student understanding of the content and concepts taught so that teachers can provide timely and precise instructional feedback to students. These types of assessments help to monitor student progress and understanding of the concepts and content being taught. These assessments also provide teachers and leadership with insight on the effectiveness of classroom instructional practices.

Classroom Based Assessments contribute 50% of the summative marks that a student receives in the core subjects of English, Mathematics and Science each semester, and contribute 100% of the summative marks in the non-core subjects of Social Studies/Global Perspectives, ICT, Chinese, Art, Music and HPE. These assessment scores help to determine the annual academic champion award winners, and as a result teachers must be able to prove that the assessments used are valid and defensible as a true indication of student progress and subject mastery.

Using Classroom Based Assessments as a large indicator of student success helps to monitor students as they are learning rather evaluate all they have learned based on one overall exam that happens twice per year. This does not remove the importance of high-stakes exams at the end of each semester, it just serves to balance the summative learning evaluated by semester exams with the formative learning that happens in the classroom daily.

As always, it is our goal to make parents aware of our work here at school and to provide any understanding or clarifications needed. Please reach out to your child's teacher or our school office with any questions you may have about assessments, exams or teaching. We are here to help!
